Always sad to see a tree one has planted having to go, but nothing is forever – so, what do we plant in its place? Seems as though I will just have to go tree shopping!!

Worth Reading: **The Lost Rainforests of Britain** by Guy Shrubsole and published by Harper Collins

Temperate rainforests were, a long time ago, widespread throughout western Britain and Ireland. Now only fragments remain, in Shropshire too, threatened, "sheepwrecked", by the demands of providing human livelihood, by deer predation and by climate change.

Their damp green beauty and sometimes spooky atmosphere have not just great aesthetic value but also as vital carbon sinks, as catchment for wild flowers and the abundant forms of mosses, lichens, lungworts, ferns celebrated here.

Guy Shrubsole provides much thought provoking material. He calls for extensive exclosure fencing to allow regeneration. Although Wales is famed for its sheep studded bare hills and mountains, this identification is questioned as we are told the true tradition, found in medieval literature, was cattle and pigs reared in widespread wood pastures. Pastures that are now barren of biodiversity.
